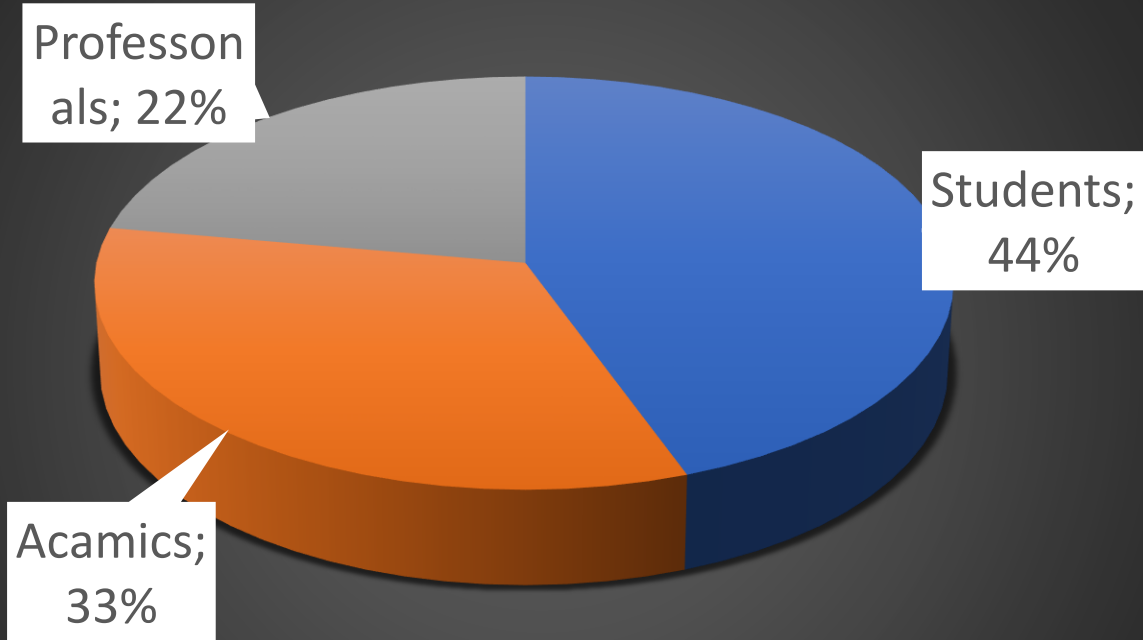

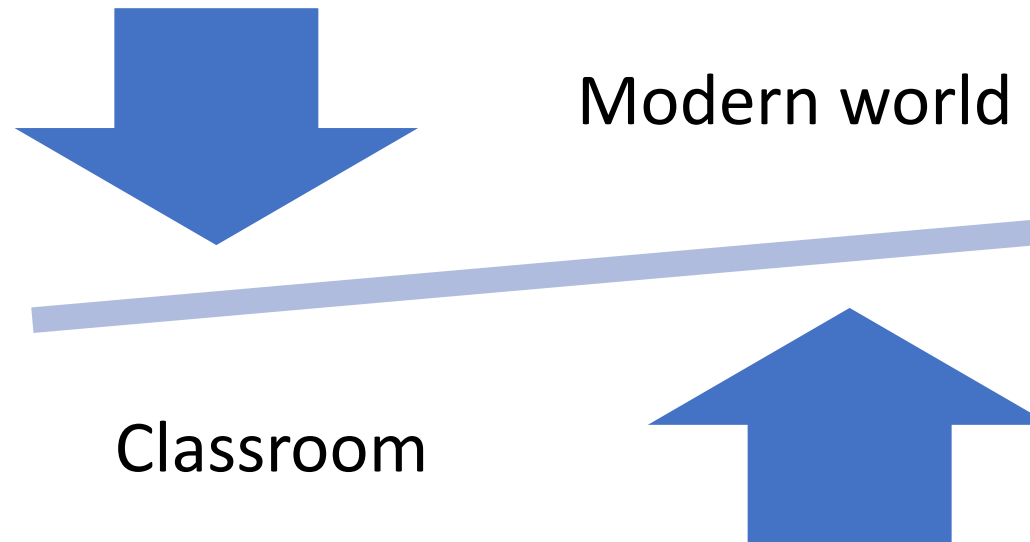

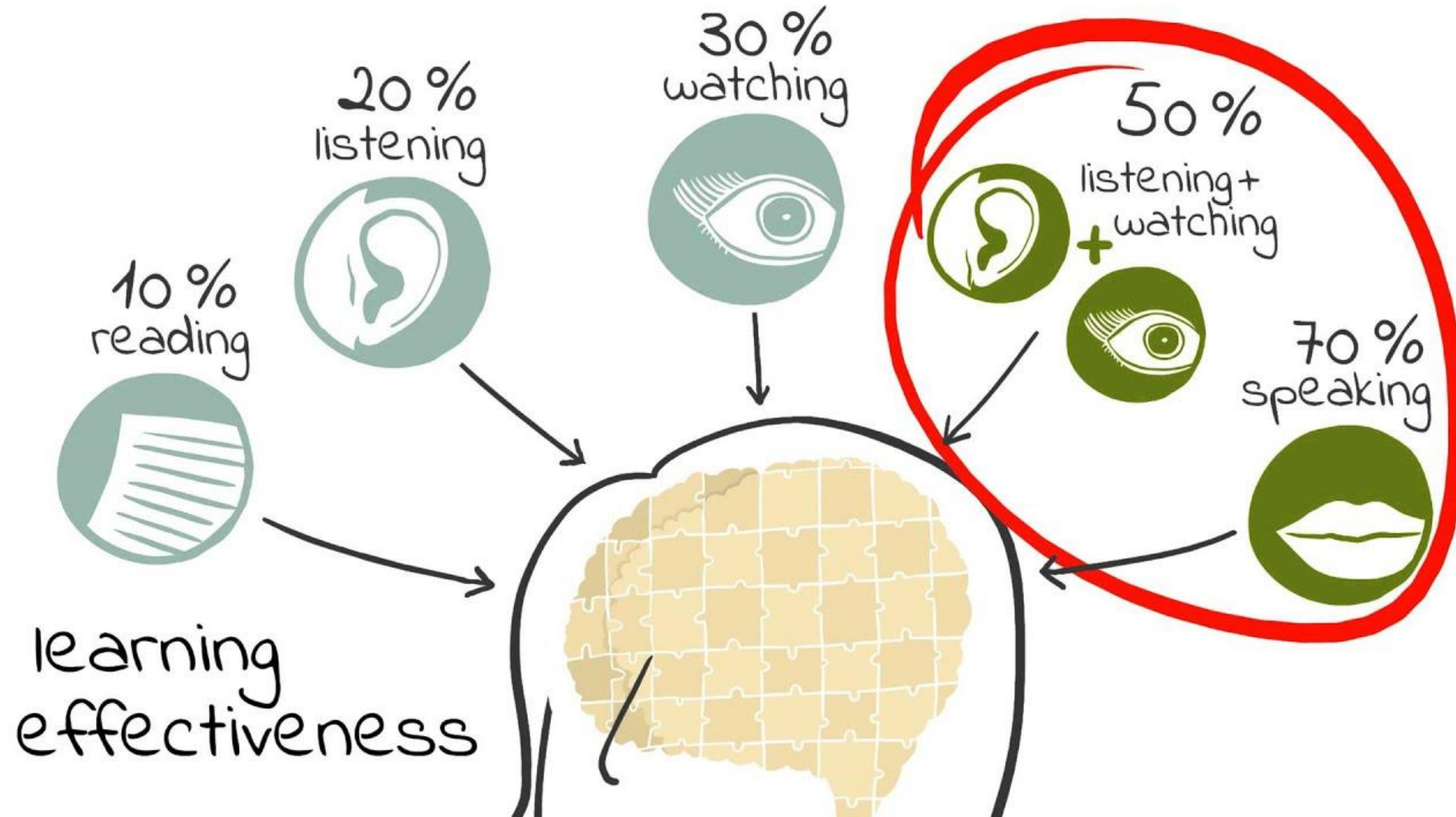


Contemporary T&L Methods

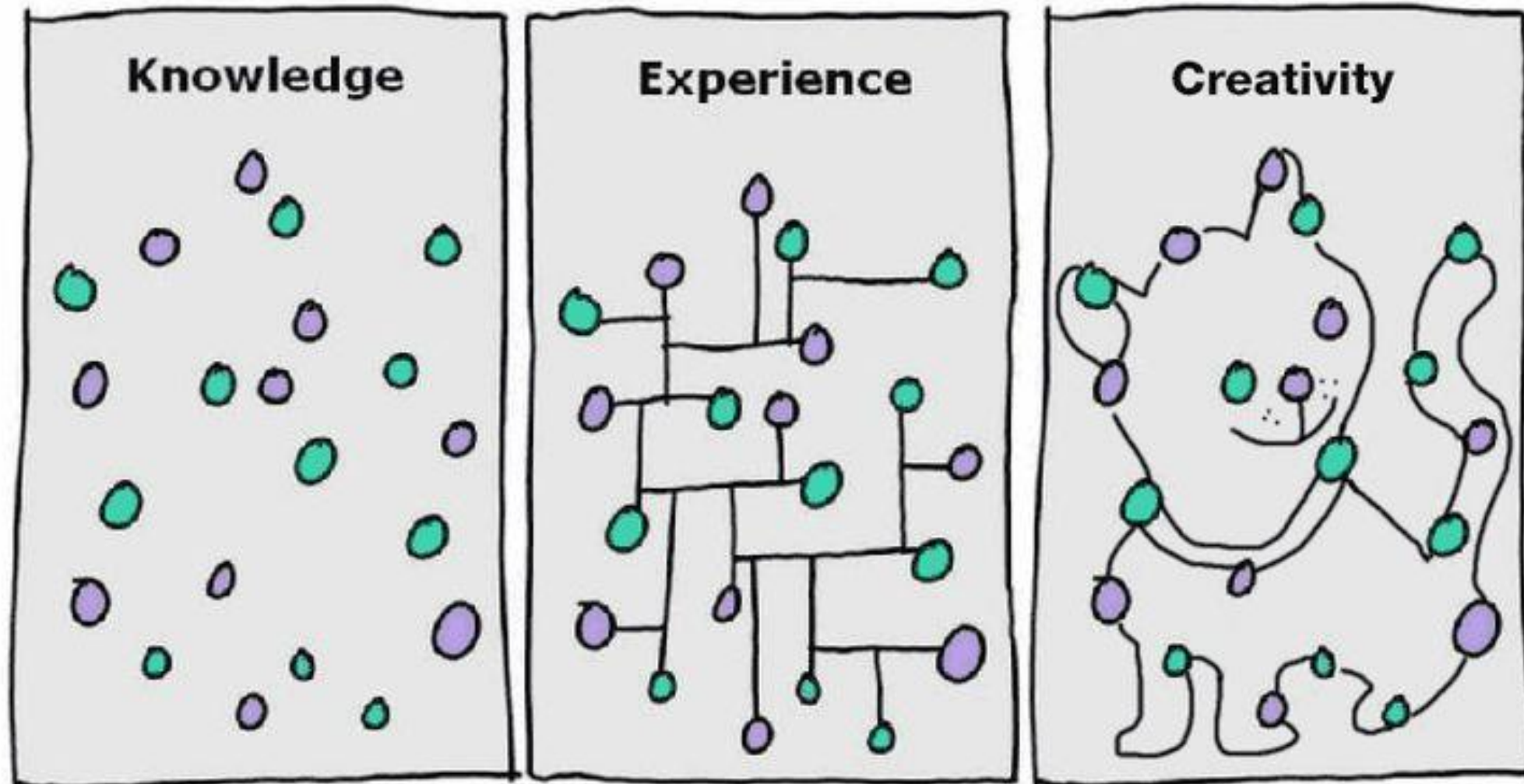
- Are the teaching/learning techniques that

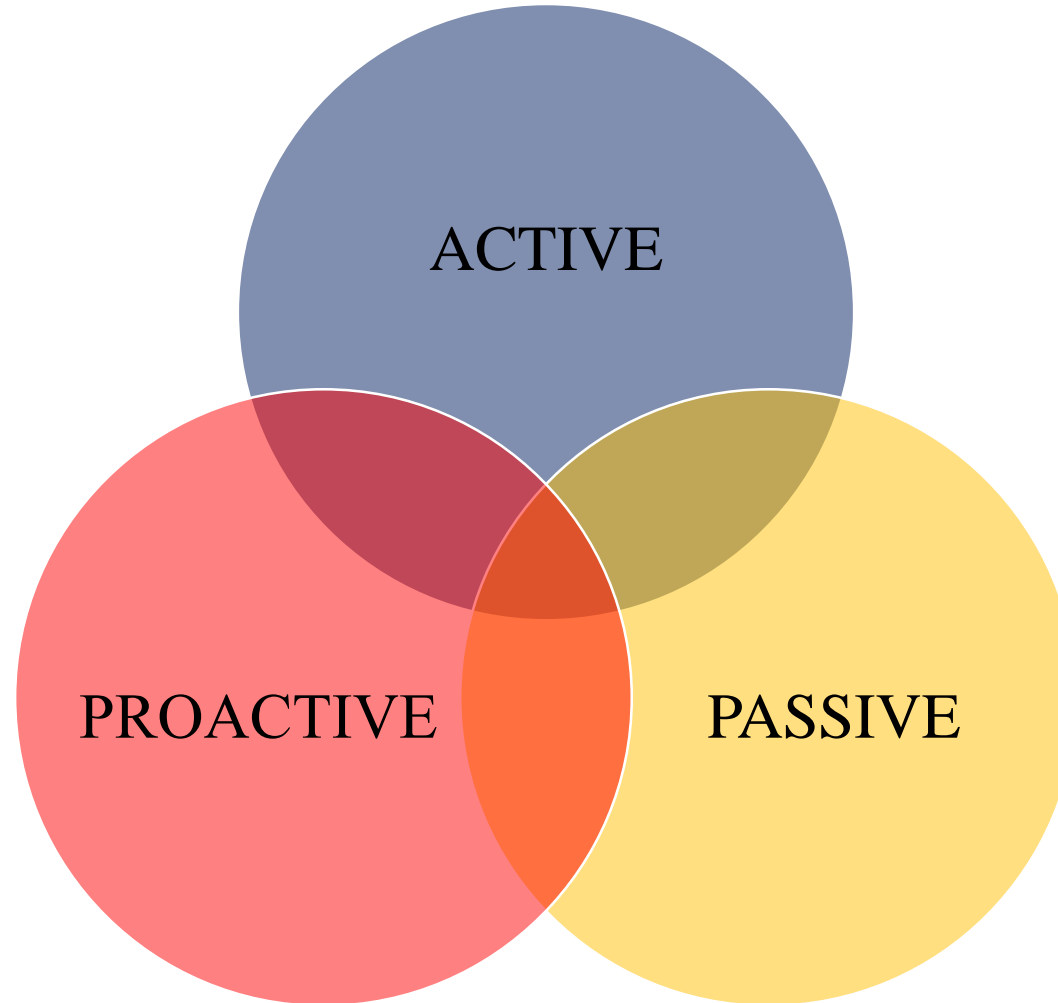
